use of the dwelling house and all the houses & springs. For Johnnie W. An-
derson's care of me & Bettie I will and bequeath unto him twenty five acres
of said land running the line in same direction. I will & bequeath unto my
son Poindestes P. Boatwright twenty five acres of said land. I also will &
bequeath unto my daughter Minnie P Cole twenty five acres of said land.
All the names to this my will, will have a full rite at my death. I have
appointed P. P. Boatwright & Johnnie W. Anderson my Executors not bound to any
