

I Nat. Amos of the County of Buckingham, do make this my last Will and Testament. After commending my soul to a merciful redeemer, I make the following bequest.

First- I devise the personal property of which I am possessed to my wife Rachael Amos, during her life, and at her death for the same to pass to my son Reuben Amos.

Second I devise and bequeath to my wife Rachel Amos the tract of land on which I now reside for her to hold and own during her life - after the death of my wife I devise and bequeath the said tract of land to my son Reuben Amos in fee simple.

Third I do hereby appoint and constitute my son Reuben Amos as Executor of this my last Will and Testament, and request that he be allowed to qualify as such without security.

In testimony whereof I have on this 19th day of October 1886 set my hand and seal.

I Permelia Davidson of Buckingham County Virginia do make this my last Will revoking all others that I may have made first I desire that all of my just debts and my burial expenses to be paid and I desire that my son William B. Davidson and Rebecca A. Davidson his wife to have all of my landed estate their life or as long as Rebecca A. Davidson remains the widow of my son William B. Davidson and then to go to his son David N. Davidson, and if he dies without an heir the land I wish to be sold and the proceeds divided between my brothers and sisters and their children I further desire that my niece Martha Alto shall have one bed and furniture I desire that my son William B. Davidson shall have my other bed with the usual furniture his life and then to be sold and the money divided between my sisters I further desire that Rebecca A. Davidson to have my sheep in witness whereof I have caused my hand and seal to be affixed to this my last Will this 13th day of Mar. 1890.
