In the name of God Amen. The twenty third day of July in
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty
Nineteen. I Nathaniel Morris of the County of Buckingham
being through the blessing of God in a sound state of mind and
memory but calling to mind the frail tenure of this life, and
that is appointed to all men once to die do make and ordain this
my last Will and Testament, that is to say I give and bequeath
to my much beloved Brothers (loved) John Morris and Samuel
Morris the whole of my property both real and personal also I
give unto them all moneys due me by bond open account or
whichever otherwise I may possess at my death. also I give unto
them the whole of my stock (viz) hogs cows horses and sheep
etc. etc. to them and their heirs forever all of which is to be di-
vided equally between them to the value of one cent. I appoint
them also as my Executors and I do hereby utterly disallow
revoke and disannul all and every other former Testaments
legacies wills bequeaths and Executors by me in any way
before named wills and bequeaths, ratifying and confirming

this and no other to be my last Will and Testament in witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and
the year first above written
