wife during her natural life after her death I wish it divided as follows 1st I will to my son Ned Bell five dollars and the money I have paid him before will be as much as my other children will get. 2^d I will to my son Pierce Bell after my wife's death to have one fourth part of my personal and real estate I also desire for his part of my real estate to be given to him so as to include the dwelling and improvements where he now resides. 3^d I also give to my daughter Kelly Walter one fourth of my personal and real estate after my wife's death I also desire her part of my real est. to be given to her so as to include the dwelling and improvements where he now resides.

4th The other half of my real estate after my wife's death I desire to be equally divided between my sons James Bell and Jordan Bell & these come in equally with the other two in the division of my personal est.

I will to my four children above named my real est. during their natural life and should they die without a lawful heir the said lands is to come back to my living four children or their heirs.
