This my last Will and Testament made this the 13th day of October 1880. I give and bequeath to my youngest daughter Mary Susan Lesueur and her bodily heirs the following mentioned property:

1st I give to her my old homestead of one hundred and seven and half acres of land adjoining John Olyborn Seons Nelson and Len Olyborn and others. I also will to her one half of the land in my father's estate, and the other half to my oldest daughter Isabella Robertson.

2nd I give to my daughter Mary Susan my interest in the Gram tract of land with the understanding that the suit that I have ordered shall never be compromised unless the parties for the defense pay or cause to be paid the sum of nine hundred dollars and five hundred for rent and damages.

I desire and wish in addition to the past that I have heretofore given to my daughter Isabella to give her a home (I will and give that in case she wishes it) she is to have a

home on the hundred and seventeen and a half acre of land heretofore given to my daughter Mary Susan as long as she lives and in case that Mary Susan dies leaving no bodily heirs all of the property herein mentioned shall go to my daughter Isabella and her bodily heirs.

I also will and give to my two sons John and Moses Levee one dollar each to be paid out of my estate.

Last of all I give to my daughter Mary Susan and her bodily heirs all of the estate both real and personal that I now own or may hereafter become heir to.
