

This my last will and testament I make in the full and free use of my mind and memory, I being of the age and law of years, and of sound mind and memory, I hereby give, devise and bequeath unto my daughter Mary E. Blake all of the property of any kind which I may possess at my death. I want to add that my daughter said Blake will get her portion of the land, & her portion of the furniture in the house I make my son J. R. Jones my executor and devise that no security be required from him, and I desire the enforcement of what I have said in this my last will.

At a County Court held for Rockingham County, State of Virginia, the 11th day of May 1882. This day appearing the last will and testament of Archibald Jones deceased, was the day produced in Court and admitted to record upon the testimony of L. J. Page who testified that he wrote the will and was present with the subscribing witnesses thereto, when said will was signed by the testator, that two of said subscribing witnesses, to wit: Joseph V. Scott and Francis Wilmon, are residents of the State of Virginia and their whereabouts unknown, and that J. R. Jones one of the subscribing witnesses is dead; And upon the testimony of J. R. Jones who proved the handwriting of J. R. Jones, Joseph V. Scott and Francis Wilmon subscribing witnesses to said will; And on the motion of J. R. Jones and Mary E. Blake letters of administration upon the estate of said Archibald Jones dec'd. unadministered, with the will of the said Archibald Jones dec'd. annexed, is committed to H. S. Perkins and thereupon the said H. S. Perkins with L. J. Page and Wm. Lancaster his recanting the Court deeming them sufficient, they having been sworn to justify, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of \$100.00 payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia and conditioned
