

In the name of God Amen I Robert M. Bramford of the County of Buckingham and State of Virginia being of a sound and disposing mind but feeble in body do make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills formerly made by me and make the following disposition of my effects after the payment of all my just debts and funeral expenses to wit:

Clause 1st I give and bequeath to my wife Martha A Bramford all the property and money of which I may be possessed (except as hereinafter provided) to have and to hold during her natural life.

Clause 2nd I bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth M. Stout a lot of land adjoining the lands of Mrs. Pagby S. B. Ayres, and S. C. Bramford which said lot I have designated by chopped lines.

Clause 3^d I bequeath to my son Saml. O. Bramford the lot of land lying north of said E. M. Stout's and adjoining the lands of S. B. Ayres, Mrs. Ayres and Cecelia A. Gentry which lot I have designated by chopped lines.

Clause 4th I bequeath to my daughter Cecelia A. Gentry a lot of land adjoining the lands of S. O. Bramford on the east, Mrs. Ayres on the north and the road known as the Cut Bank Road being the line on the west and adjoining R. M. Bramford on the South, which lot I have designated by chopped lines.

Clause 5th I bequeath to the children of my son J. M. Bramford dec'd. the lot of land lying on the Cut Bank Road and west of it and adjoining the lands of Mrs. Ayres on the north R. P. Howell and Judith M. Bramford on the west and R. M. Bramford on the south, which lot I have designated by chopped lines. I also bequeath to the above mentioned children of J. M. Bramford dec'd. a bird executed by said J. M. Bramford dec'd. to R. P. Howell & Judith M. Bramford.

du^o the lot of land lying on the But. Bank Road and west of it and adjoining the lands of E. M. Agee on the north R. P. Howell and Judith M. Bramford on the west and A. M. Bramford on the south, which lot I have designated by chopps lines. I also bequeath to the above mentioned children of m^o M. Bramford, du^o a bond executed by said J. M. Bramford, du^o to P. A. Bramford, du^o and also all accounts against the Est. of said J. M. Bramford which may be in my possession.

Clause 6th I bequeath to my son R. M. Bramford a lot of land adjoining the lands of E. M. Stout on the east Cecilia A. Leetry and the children of m^o M. Bramford du^o on the north and Judt M. Bramford on the west and C. G. Macey on the south which I have designated by chopps lines.

Clause 7th I bequeath to my daughter Caroline G. Macey the lot of land on which is my dwelling beginning at a corner on the road north of east from the tobacco house adjoining the lands of R. M. Bramford on the east, R. M. and Judith M. Bramford on the north Antonio Tucker and the E. Robertson on the west and E. Robertson on the south. I also bequeath to C. G. Macey a lot of land adjoining the lands of E. M. Stout on the east, R. M. Bramford on the north and including all my land not herein before disposed of, both of which lots I have designated by chopps lines. I also bequeath to C. G. Macey one horse, two beds with the furniture thereto belonging. I bequeath my carpenters tools jointly to C. G. Macey and S. O. Bramford. I bequeath to my daughter C. G. Macey all the furniture I got from my brother Hillery.

Clause 8th I bequeath to my daughter E. M. Stout one old fashioned bedstead and feather tick one new yarn counterpane, one white, and one red stripes cotton one, one sheet and pair of pillows, and bolster, one bureau, one butter pot, one large wash pot which she

Clause 9th I bequeath to my son O. M. Pransford one straw bed, one sofa, one large white chest, two chairs, land strainer, large waiter, one yam counterpane and some other bed clothes.

Clause 10th I bequeath to my daughter Cecelia A. Gentry one feather bed, one old half curtain bedstead, 1 leaf table, 1 new yam counterpane, one white one, 1 sheet, bolster and pair of pillows, 1 large oval white bowl, 1 butter pot.

Clause 11th I bequeath to my daughter C. G. Maxey my half curtain bedstead and feather tick, 1 new yam counterpane, one white one, and one calico one, 1 sheet, bolster and pair of pillows, long table and large boiler 1 pref washstand and chest.

Clause 12th I bequeath to my son S. O. Pransford 1 straw bed, some bed clothes, 1 yam counterpane table that he now has, clock, reel and large pot.

Clause 13th I bequeath to the children of J. M. Pransford, div^d 1 straw bed, 1 yam counterpane, and some other bed clothes, 1 large cupboard, 2 small trunks, one chest one small side table, and 1 small trundle bedstead. The other table furniture not herein before disposed of to be divided between the children of J. M. Pransford div^d Robt M and S. O. Pransford To E. M. Stouth and S. O. Pransford I bequeath my loom.

Clause 14th I appoint Saml O. Pransford and J. A. Maxey or either of them Executors to carry out the provisions of this my Will this the 4th day of July 1870.
