

The following is a copy of the paper dated 19th December 1867
 referred to in the foregoing Order

"I Robert I Gillispie of the County of Buckingham
 and State of Virginia, do hereby declare this my last Will and
 Testament in manner and form as follows to-wit:

I having two sets of children by two separate wives
 and having heretofore given to my several children by my first wife
 viz Ann Wilson, William I Gillispie, Francis C Bagby, Sarah E.
 Gillispie, Mary A Boughan and James L Gillispie, except Sarah E
 Gillispie when they were respectively minors what I intended to
 give them. I now give and bequeath to my said daughter Sarah
 E Gillispie during her natural life, and if she should die with-
 out lawfull issue, and in that event to my grand children Fran-
 cis C Bagby and Robert L Bagby, all that part or parcel of
 land beginning at a poplar tree at or near the mouth of George
 M. Gillispie's spring branch where it enters into the long branch,
 thence westwardly by a new line across Monro's Road to a rock spring
 in a small branch, thence down that branch as it meanders to Gillie's
 line, thence along Gillie's line to Henry C Boughan's corner thence
 along Boughan's line to H. T. Meredith's line, thence along Davis
 Maddox' div^d old line to the beginning. I give to my said daughter
 all the land lying within the said boundaries supposed to be one
 hundred and fifty acres more or less with the reservations here-
 after to be made. I give further to my said daughter one bed
 and furniture. I wish it to be distinctly understood that if
 my said daughter should claim her interest in the land which
 descended from her mother, or should refuse to relinquish
 that interest then the foregoing provision made for her ben-

all the land lying within the said boundaries, together with
hundred and fifty-acre more or less with the reservations here-
after to be made. I give further to my said daughter one bed
and furniture. I wish it to be distinctly understood, that if
my said daughter should claim her interest in the land which
descended from her mother, or should refuse to relinquish
that interest, then the foregoing provision made for her ben-
efit to be null and void.

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Maryinda Gillispie
all my personal estate of whatsoever value or kind it may be,
and I give furthermore to my said wife to have and to hold
the same during her natural life all my real estate except
the land herein before given to my daughter Sarah B. Gillispie.
It is my Will and desire that at the death of my said wife
my real estate except what I have heretofore given to my
said daughter shall be divided between my children by my
present wife viz: Martha V. Smith, Alice M. Gillispie and
George M. Gillispie, as follows to my son George M. Gillispie
two thirds of all my land, and the remaining one third to
my daughters Martha V. Smith and Alice M. Gillispie to
be equally divided between them. I hereby constitute and appoint
my wife Maryinda Gillispie, and my son George M. Gillispie
to execute this my last Will and Testament. In testimony where-
