In the name of God Amen I, Robert W. Hill of Bear Garden in Buckingham County Virginia do make this as my last Will & Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me at any time heretofore made.

My Bear Garden estate has been divided into 3 lots Nos One two, and three. The former field is lot No four not surveyed but supposed to contain one hundred & twenty acres more or less. Lot No. five embraces wood land west of Phelps Creek adjoining the lands of J. D. McKenna & M. S. Staples & others. Lot No. six embraces the wood land on head waters of Phelps Creek & adjoins the lands of Daniel Martin & others.

I give 1st I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Virginia A. Hill in fee simple Lot No. two (which includes my dwelling) containing one hundred & forty seven acres and fifty acres of lot No. six on head waters of Phelps Creek and twenty five acres of lot No. four adjoining lands of J. D. McKenna and M. S. Staples as per plat of N. B. Nicholas 1888 which is hereby revised & made a part of this instrument.

I also give to my wife Virginia A. Hill in fee simple all of my house hold & kitchen furniture all of my horses, mules, cattle & stock of every description all of my tools & farming implements of every kind, my buggy & carriage if any on hand, all of my crops on hand & such as may be growing on my farm. I also give to my wife or the owner of lot No. two the use of the spring on lot No. three at Lee Hall and that right be a path way to same.

I give, devise and bequeath to W. H. Williams, of Tennessee, the sum in Trust for the benefit of Samuel Tugue and his wife, Sarah Tugue & their children now born or which may hereafter be born to them lot No. one containing as per survey of W. B. Nicholas 788.8 fifty acres. I also give & bequeath to said trustee for the benefit of said Tugue & wife & children twenty five acres of north east corner of Furnace field, also fifteen acres of wood land on Phelps Creek in lot No. five, said land to be held by said trustee during the life of said Samuel Tugue and wife for their support or the support of the survivor, and at their death to divide & pay to their children or descendants, and it is expressly ordered & directed that said property so given him in trust as aforesaid shall not in any way be liable to the debts contracted or liabilities of said Samuel Tugue either now existing or which may hereafter exist.

Item 3rd I direct that my store house in Farmville be sold at once by my Executive hereinafter named and the proceeds be applied to the payment of my debts if any and after the payment of my debts I desire that the balance of aforesaid proceeds be paid to my brother Joseph A. Hill of Tennessee.

Item 4th I give, bequeath and devise to my wife Virginia A. Hill during her life or widowhood lot No. three and such parts of the Furnace field and lots Nos. four, five and six as have not been herebefore disposed of unless it be necessary to sell as directed in item No. five. At the death or marriage of my wife Virginia A. Hill I direct that lot No. three and such parts of the Furnace field and of lots No. four, five and six as I have given her during her life or widowhood to be sold and the proceeds of such sale to be distributed as follows: One third of proceeds of said sale to my brother Joseph A. Hill of Tennessee. The remaining two thirds I wish divided equally between my nephews & nieces as follows: M. D.

Item 5th Should the proceeds of the sale of my Farmville property be not sufficient to pay my indebtedness I direct that lot No three and such parts of the farm field and of lots No four, five and six as have not been heretofore disposed of be sold at once by my Executor as hereinafter named and the proceeds of such sale be applied to the payment of the remainder of my debts and the balance be distributed as directed in item No four.

Item 6th I do nominate and appoint my wife Virginia A. Hill Executrix of this my last Will and Testament and request that she be allowed to qualify as such without giving any security, and I also request that no inventory be taken of my personal property.
