1st I give & bequeath my Soul to "God. The giver of every good & perfect gift" Amen.
2nd I desire that my body may be buried at the direction of my Dear Husband & I direct that all my just debts be paid out of my estate as soon after my decease as may be convenient

3rd I give & bequeath unto my dear husband Samuel F. Abraham in testimony of my sincere regards & affection for him, certain & three fourths acre of land which I inherited in fee simple of my Father Benjamin S. Reynolds, dec^d. With all the appurtenances belonging thereto. To have & to hold his natural life for his own use & behoof to do as he sees fit to do with. I do this that he may not be left dependant in his old age should he out live my self.

4th I further give & bequeath to my Husband S. F. Abraham all of my household & kitchen goods of every description to have & to hold singular all of his natural life to do as he sees fit to do with.

5th I further give & bequeath unto my said Husband S. F. Abraham all property money, stocks Bonds or any other evidences of indebtedness to me Sallie E. Abraham to have & to hold all of his natural life, & I declare this to be my last Will & testament & I do hereby revoke & make void all former or other wills made by me at any time heretofore made & I do hereby declare by these presents to be & contained this my last will & testament.

In testimony whereof I the said testator Sallie E. Abraham have to this my said last will written upon one sheet of paper, set my hand & seal, this the 26 day of June in the year one thousand nine hundred & two (1902)
