

I, Dally Moreley, of the County of Buckingham, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other and former Wills that have been made by me.

First. Out of the money I may have on hand at my death, and out of my stock and the bonds due me I desire that all my just debts be paid.

Secondly. After the payment of my debts I desire all my monies, stock and bonds of every description to be divided into two equal parts. One of said equal parts I give to my son W^m P. Moreley and his heirs forever. The other of said equal parts I give to my grand children Eliza Taylor, Marcia, Mildred, Alfred S. William Oswald and Ella Moreley, children of my daughter Eliza F. Moreley, to be divided equally between my said grand children.

Thirdly. I desire that all my interest in the lands left by my father William Perkins, as well as the money arising from that portion which has been sold as my interest in that portion of it now held and occupied by my sister Nancy L. Perkins be divided into two equal parts, and I give to my son William P. Moreley one of said equal parts, and the other of said equal parts I give to be divided equally between the above named grand children Eliza Taylor, Marcia, Mildred, Alfred S. William Oswald and Ella Moreley, children of my daughter Eliza F. Moreley.

Fourthly. I give to my son William P. Moreley and his heirs forever the following slaves viz. Napoleon, Randolph, Jackson, Phillis, Elsie and his three children Dacia, Fanny and Julia, together with the future increase of said slaves.

Fifthly. I give my negro man Martin to my grandson Langdon C. Moreley.

Seventhly. Before my money is divided under the second clause of this will. I give out of it to my daughter Eliza W. Moreley the sum of fifty dollars; and to each of my grand children Thomas & Alexander, George P. and Angelina ^{children of my said daughter Maria} ~~children of my said daughter Maria~~ the sum of fifty dollars. I make this bequest to my daughter and to my grand children, named in this clause of my will of fifty dollars each, as a testimonial of my affection for them: and I have given them no larger portion of my estate because they are well provided for.

Eighthly. I give to my son William P. Moreley all monies that he owes me for the rent of land and for the hire of negroes, which land and negroes belong to me, and have been used, occupied and worked by my said son for many years past, and I also give to the said William P. Moreley all rents for said land, and all hire for said negroes that may accrue from this time to my death: and I direct that the said William P. Moreley is not to account to any one for the said rents and hire that have already accrued or that may hereafter accrue.

Ninthly. Among the bonds I hold is one executed to me by my son William P. Moreley. This bond bears no interest, and I direct that he is not to be required to pay any interest on the amount due on said bond.

Lastly. I appoint William P. Moreley and Granderson Moreley executors of this my last Will and Testament.

Wm Hocker their security entered into and acknowledged a bond in the
penalty of \$20,000 conditioned according to law, certificate is granted
the said Executors for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form.

First I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be
paid.

Secondly I give and bequeath to A. Trent Mosley trustee my whole
estate of every description real personal and mixed, upon trust that he
shall hold the same for the separate use of my daughter who may
be living at my death. And if at my death any one or more of
my daughter or daughter married or single should be without a home,
such property real and personal shall be permitted to occupy and enjoy
so destitute of a home, even if such destitution continue during her
life, and if at any time during that time any other of
my daughter or daughter married or single should be destitute of the said
property during the continuance of their destitution. And during such
absence and enjoyment of said property it is to be for the exclusive
use and enjoyment of my daughter and enjoy it - those
at any time there be none of my daughter so destitute
they derive it, my whole estate shall be divided
