I Leases Bolling of Buckingham County Virginia by occupation and profession physician and farmer do make this my last will and testament - hereby revoking all former wills made by me at any time heretofore - in manner and form as follows that is to say - after my decease - I direct that my body be decently interred in the family grave yard, near my mansion - in manner and form corresponding to my estate and station in life - And as soon thereafter as practicable that my wife, Amanda C. Bolling whom I do hereby constitute and appoint executrix to this my last will and testament - pay my burial expences and all my other just debts - with such money as there may be on hand and coming to me or the sale of such property that can be disposed of - and after all my just debts shall have been paid - that the residue of my estate of every description - personal and real - I leave by this my last will, in the possession and control of my beloved wife Amanda C. Bolling as a support for her during her life time - or her widow hood - and at the death of my wife - that my real estate be disposed of as follows - namely I give and devise to my youngest son Ivanhoe A. Bolling and his heirs - the mansion house and one hundred and thirty two acres of land - lying to east of a pond and North of the road leading to the dwelling house - I give and devise to my son Alexander M. Bolling and his heirs - One hundred acres of land to be cut off in such way as to give water, &c. The residue of my real estate I give and devise to my first
