Item First. I give to my niece Susan E. Brown, should she survive me, and if not, to her descendants, and should she have no descendants at my death, then to her husband James A. Brown, my farm lying in Buckingham County, and known as "Locust Grove", containing two hundred and fifty two acres more or less, and also the adjoining field known as the "Road Field", containing one hundred and thirty one acre more or less, also one sideboard, six chairs, one clock, and three beds and cover. This farm adjoins the lands of Thomas B. Norvell Dr. Robert Jones home place and Richard Moseley's estate.

Item Second. I give to my niece Miss Jennie J. Steger, the whole place known as John B. Agie's homestead, lying on Slate River in Buckingham County, and containing sixty nine and a half acres more or less. Should the said Jennie J. Steger not survive me, then I give this land to the parties to whom the property in item first is given, and in the same manner.

Item Third. I give to my niece Mrs. Mary E. Kunkle for her life, a tract of land lying on Slate River in Buckingham County, known as the "Green Slive", and containing about one hundred and forty seven acres being a part of Col. Jack Agie's farm, also six ten acres. Said land and improvements thereon

I give the said Mary E. Nuckels for life, I give after her death to her daughter Susan Nuckels; Should she be living then. If she, the said Susan Nuckels, should not be living at the death of her mother, the said Mary E. Nuckels, I then give all said property to the descendants of said Susan Nuckels, or if there should be no such descendant, then to the descendants of the said Mary E. Nuckels.
