I direct that a watch be purchased for my brother E. W. Hubbard and W. J. Hubbard before the division of my estate.

My home I leave to my mother.

My mss. copy rights to my brother, W. J. Hubbard.

I request that my funeral expenses shall be simple and moderate. The place of interment I wish my mother to decide. I suggest however that a vault be built at Saratoga, my father and sister be removed and all of us rest together.

My share in my husband's estate not heretofore devised I give and bequeath to my mother and brothers to be equally divided between them.

And of this my last Will and testament I make and appoint my brother E. W. Hubbard sole Executor.

At a County Court held for Buckingham County March 13th 1882. This paper writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Susan M. Crow, deceased, was this day produced in Court, and there being no subscribing witnesses, then to Andrew J. Epper and Willie J. Hubbard, were sworn, and severally deposed that they are well acquainted with the handwriting of the said Susan M. Crow, deceased, and verily believe that the said Will and the signature thereto subscribed are wholly in the handwriting of the said Susan M. Crow, deceased. Whereupon the same is ordered to be recorded as the true last Will and Testament of the said Susan M. Crow, deceased.

And at another day, to wit, at the same Court continued and held for said County, March 14th 1882. On the motion of E. W. Hubbard the executor named in the last Will and Testament of Susan M. Crow, deceased, admitted to probate on yesterday, this day appears in Court, and having made oath thereto as the law directs, and with J. A. Hubbard, W. J. Hubbard and J. E. Hubbard by P. A. Forbes, their attorney in fact, his securities, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of \$10,000 payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia, and conditioned according to law, certificate is granted the said E. W. Hubbard for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form.

This cause having been in all respects regularly matters came on
this day to be heard on the petition together with the Journal, evidence and

and said Will also devises to Elizabeth B Shepard one hundred and seventy
three (173) acres of land in said County about 14 miles south east of Buck-
ingham Court House on the south side of the Ga Ira and Buckingham Court
House Road, and bounded on the west by the land of R. T. Hubbard, on the south

ham Court House, on the north side of the Ga Ira and Buckingham Court House Road to Louisa Shepard, said land being bounded as follows to-wit on the north and east by the land of S. T. Heddleston, on the west by R. T. Hubbard, on the south by the Ga Ira and Buckingham Court House Road, and said Will also devises to Elizabeth O. Shepard one hundred and seventy three (173) acres of land in said County about 121 miles south east of Buckingham Court House on the ^{south} side of the Ga Ira and Buckingham Court House Road, and bounded on the west by the land of R. T. Hubbard, on the south and east by the land of M. O. Richardson and on the north by the Ga Ira and Buckingham Court House Road - the record of said Will and the original Will have been destroyed - the Court doth therefore order that this Order be entered and stand as for, and in the place of said original Will and the record thereof. And the Court doth further order that the Clerk of the Court do copy this Order at large and certify the same to the Clerk of the County Court of this County to be by him entered in the book containing and set apart for the record of Wills, and that he index the same in the manner Wills are indexed as requires by law, ~~which order when so recorded and indexed shall be as effectual to all~~ intents and for all purposes as the original record of said Will.
