Secondly: I give to my beloved wife Susan A. Agee, all of my estate both real and personal in fee simple to do and to dispose of as she may think proper. Lastly: I appoint my beloved wife Susan A. Agee my Executrix to this my last Will and Testament, and ask the Court not to require any security of her. Given under my hand this the 12th day of May 1874.

At a County Court held for Buckingham County, May 8th 1876 This paper writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of T. Mosley Agee, dec^d. was this day produced in Court, and proved by the oath of J. P. Jones and D. W. Stinson, two of the subscribing witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Susan A. Agee, the executrix named in said Will, who made oath thereto, and enters into and acknowledges a bond in the penalty of \$2000. conditions according to Law, without security, the testator by his Will directing that money

I William H. Chappell make this my last Will and Testament as
follows viz I direct my Executor to pay all my just debts. 2^d I direct
my Executor to keep my property both real and personal in hand un-
til the youngest child becomes of age. This property shall be kept
for the joint use of my wife and children and so much of the pro-
ceeds as can be spared from food and clothing shall be expended
in the education of the children. It is my Will that no separate
account be kept for the money expended in the education and
maintenance of my children but that each one shall have the
good and substantial an education as the proceeds of the property
will admit. It is my Will that no inventory or appraisement be made
of my household property. I hereby appoint my wife executrix and
she shall not be required to give security on her official bonds.

In testimony that the foregoing is my last Will and Testament
written wholly by myself, I hereby affix my hand and seal this 14th
day of April 1868.
