To my son David A. Parrack I give one sixth part of ^{all} my estate. To my son Thomas B. Parrack I give one sixth part of all my estate. To my daughter Eveline Davidson I give one sixth part of all my estate. To my grand daughter Florence Parrack daughter of my son W^m H. Parrack I give one sixth part of all my estate. To my grand daughters Virginia Shaw and Judith Shaw I give one sixth part of all my estate to be equally divided between them. To my grand children Walter and Marion Forbes daughters of Peter H. Forbes I give one sixth of all my estate to be equally divided between them. Lastly I hereby appoint my son David A. Parrack Executor of this my last Will, and it is my wish that my said son be allowed to qualify as Executor without giving security.
