

J. T. L. Gibson of the County of Buckingham do hereby make this my last will and testament

First I give in trust to S. B. Gibson and J. C. Woodson as trustees the sum of three thousand dollars for the benefit of Adocia Ann Gibson she to receive the annual interest from the same during her life time and at her death the principal to go to my great nephew Thomas G. Woodson

Second I give in trust to S. B. Gibson and J. C. Woodson as trustees the sum of two thousand dollars for the benefit of Susan C. Gibson she to receive the annual interest from the same during her life and at her death the principal to go one half to the heirs of Mary G. Boatwright and one half to the heirs of Bennie G. Woodson.

Third I give in trust to J. C. Woodson and S. B. Gibson as trustees the sum of five thousand dollars for the benefit of S. B. Gibson he to receive the annual income during his life and at his death the principal to go one half to the heirs of Mary G. Boatwright & one half to the heirs of Bennie G. Woodson.

Fourth I give in trust, to J. C. Woodson and S. B. Gibson as Trustees all the residue of my personal property for the benefit of Mary G. Boatwright and Bennie G. Woodson they to receive equally the annual interest during their lives and at their death the principal to go one half to the heirs of Mary G. Boatwright and one half to the heirs of Bennie G. Woodson.

Fifth I give to Bennie G. Woodson four acres of land in the County of Campbell in what is known as Rivermont.

Sixth I give to S. B. Gibson, Adocia Ann Gibson, and Susan C. Gibson my farm upon which I now reside in the County of Buckingham as a home during their lives and at their death the land to be equally divided between Mary G. Boatwright and Bennie G. Woodson but if they should wish to sell the said farm then may do so by consent of all parties.

Second I give in trust to S. B. Gibson and J. C. Woodson as trustees the sum of two thousand dollars for the benefit of Susan C. Gibson she to receive the annual interest from the same during her life and at her death the principal to go one half to the heirs of Mary G. Boatwright and one half to the heirs of Bennie G. Woodson.

Third I give in trust to J. C. Woodson and S. B. Gibson as trustees the sum of five thousand dollars for the benefit of S. B. Gibson he to receive the annual income during his life and at his death the principal to go one half to the heirs of Mary G. Boatwright & one half to the heirs of Bennie G. Woodson.

Fourth I give in trust to J. C. Woodson and S. B. Gibson as Trustees all the residue of my personal property for the benefit of Mary G. Boatwright and Bennie G. Woodson they to receive equally the annual interest during their lives and at their death the principal to go one half to the heirs of Mary G. Boatwright and one half to the heirs of Bennie G. Woodson.

Fifth I give to Bennie G. Woodson four acres of land in the County of Campbell in what is known as Rivermont.

Sixth I give to S. B. Gibson, Adelia Ann Gibson, and Susan C. Gibson my farm upon which I now reside in the County of Buckingham as a home during their lives and at their death the land to be equally divided between Mary G. Boatwright and Bennie G. Woodson but if they should wish to sell the said farm they may do so by consent of all parties interested and the proceeds of said sale to be invested upon the same terms and conditions as the farm is willed.

I hereby appoint J. C. Woodson and S. B. Gibson my executors and ask that the Court require no security of them. Signed and
