

I Wm P Boatwright of Buckingham County and State of Virginia, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in the following, form and words to-wit:

Item 1st In consideration of the past and present services of my wife's nephew, Thos. B. Bagby I give to him and his children one hundred and ten acres of land, commencing at the Mill Pond and running up the line between me and Mrs. Cynthia B. Boston sufficiently far to include the house now occupied by James Melton thence on including the old orchard from the grave yard down. I also give him my plantation tools of all kinds, plow gear &c also my household and kitchen furniture except my 2 best beds and clothing for the same.

Item 2nd I give all the balance of my land and property after paying my just debts to my brothers and sisters or their children if they are dead.

Item 3 I hereby appoint my brother Thos. Boatwright my Executor to carry into effect this my last Will and Testament without giving security to execute the same.

Item 4th I hereby grant permission to my wife's nephew, Thos. B. Bagby to go on and build where he may select a situation, on the land given to him and his children without being molested by any one. In witness whereof I hereunto affix my hand and seal this the 29th day of August 1873.

At a County Court held for Buckingham County April 13th 1874. This paper writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of William P. Boatwright was this day produced in Court, and proved by the oath of James Woodfin, a subscribing witness thereto. And at another day, said writing was further proved by the oaths of Alfred S. Hodgins, another subscribing witness thereto, and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Thomas Boatwright, the Executor named in said Will, who made oath thereto, and entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of \$50 without security, the testator, by his Will, directing that none should be required certificate was granted the said Executor for obtaining a probat^{of} said Will in due form.

I direct that my slaves Callhoun Morton Lizzie and her children now born, or hereafter to be born, Mary Sophia daughter of Mary, Susan daughter of Mary, Millie son of Susan, Paulus Henry Daskford, and Jack be emancipated and set free, the said Paulus Henry and Daskford being now in the possession of and claimed by Charles E. Christian my will in relation to them is to depend upon my title to them; and I further direct that
