1783 In the Year of Our Lord 1783 I Achilles - Bloomer of Cam-
bell County being very weak in Body but of perfect Mind
and memory Thanks be given unto God for the same and
Calling to Mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing
that it is Appointed for all men to die do make and Or-
dain this my last Will and Testament that is to say First
I give and bequeath of all I give and Recommend my soul
to the hands of God that gave it and for my Body I recom-
mend to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent
Manner Nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God
and as Touching such Worldly Estate where with it hath
pleased God to bless me I in this life give devise and
dispose of the same in manner and following that is to
say In the first place my Will and desire is that all my
Debts be Justly paid I send to my Wife Elizabeth Bloomer
during as long as she remains my Widow my plantation
whereon I now live together with ^{all} my ^{other} ^{estate}

to the hands of God that gave it and for my Body I recom-
mend to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like and decent
Manner Nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God
and as touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it hath
pleased God to bless me ~~in~~ ^{during} this life I give devise and
dispose of the same in manner and following that is to
say In the first place my Will and desire is that all my
Debts be Justly paid I lend to my Wife Elizabeth Moreman
during as long as she remains my Widow my Plantation
whereon I now live together with ^{all} my Negroes and Stock
and all my moveable Estate except one Negroe whose name
is Sary. I give unto my son Jesse Moreman the above said
Plantation with six Hundred and fifty Eight Acres on the
said Tract and two Hundred and Twenty Eight Acres (viz)
lying on Little Seneca at his Mother's death to him and his heirs
or assigns forever but if he should die without heirs to be
Equally divided Amongst his three Brothers I give unto my
son Jesse Moreman one Negroe whose name is Peg One

A Negro Man named John Negro Bay named
Solomon to turn and his heirs or assigns forever One
Young Bay. There two feather Beds and furniture four
Cows and Calves Sixty Head of Hogs Six head of Sheep
Six Pewter Dishes One Dozen of Pewter Plates One Oval
Walnut Tree Table and One chest I give unto my
son Charles Mooreman One Negro fellow named Squire
to him and to his heirs or assigns forever. I give unto my
son Andrew Mooreman One Negro fellow named Davy to
him and to his heirs or assigns forever. I give unto my
sons Charles Mooreman and Andrew Mooreman a Negro
Man named Turk to them and their heirs to be equally
divided between them. I give unto my son William
Mooreman a Negro Boy named Toby and a Negro
Boy named George to turn and to his heirs or assigns
forever. My Will and desire is that my Executors shall
pay unto Mary Allince Thirty Pounds Out of my estate
my Will and desire is that all the rest of my moveable
estate be divided equally between my three sons

pay unto Mary Allince Thirty Pounds Out of my estate
my Will and desire is that all the rest of my moveable
Estate be Equally divided among my four sons Charles
Thomas Andrew & William Moreman & so I do
hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul
all and every other former Testaments Wills and bequests
bequests and executors by me in any way before this have
made Willed and bequeathed Ratifying and Confirming
this and no other to be my last Will and Testament and
I do constitute make and Ordain and Appoint Charles
Moreman Andrew Moreman William Moreman my Execu-
tors of this my last Will ^{and} Testament In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Twenty fifth
day of May 1783. Signed Sealed Published pronounced
and declared by the said Achilles Moreman as his last Will
and Testament in the Presence of us the Subscribers

A Court held for Campbell County December 24. 1785

The within last Will and Testament of Achilles Moorman Deceased was proved by the Oaths of Thomas Fitcher and Christopher Saunders Witnesses thereto subscribed and Ordered to be Recorded. And on the Motion of Charles Moorman Andrew Moorman and William Moorman the Executors therein named Certificate is granted them for obtaining Probate thereof in due form giving security whereupon they together with John Honorable Jesse Moorman and Henry Edson their securities entered into and Acknowledged their Bond in the Penalty of two Thousand Pounds Conditioned as the Law directs for the said Executors due and faithful administration of the said Decedents Estate and Performance of his Will.
