August in the year of Our Lord God 1771 I
Abraham Hainston of the County of Bedford in
Virginia being very sick and weak in body but
of a clear mind and memory thank be given to
God for the same and calling to mind the mortality
of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for
all men once to die do make and Ordain this my
last Will and Testament that is to say, I give
and first of all I give and Recommend my
soul to the hands of God that gave it and for my
body I Recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a
Christian like and decent manner at the Discre-
tion of my Executors Nothing Doubting but at
the General Resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty Power of God and as touch-
ing such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased

God to bless me with in this life. I give and
dispose of the same in manner and form fol-
lowing that is to say in this first place I give
and bequeath unto my two Loving sons Peter
Hairston and H. J. Hairston five shillings each
also, I allow and will that all my Just Debts
be paid out of my movable Estate also I give
unto my Loving wife Elizabeth one third part
of my Estate to Inherit during her natural
life and then to be divided amongst all my
Daughters Equally that is a lower at that time
and the Remainder of my Estate both Real
and Personal my Will is that it be sold and
fully divided amongst my Daughters Jane
Elizabeth Precila Emma Margaret and
Susanne I also Appoint Samuel Hairston whole
and Sole Executor of this my last will and

Testament and I do hereby disavow Uroch
and disavow all and every Other Testament
Wills and Legacies and Executors by me or my
or any Named Will and bequeathed Statify-
ing this and no Other to be my last Will and

set my hand and seal this day and year a

dred Pounds Conditioned as the Law Directs
for the said Administration due and faith-
full Administration of the said Decedents
Estate and Performance of his Will. Samuel

thereto According to Law Certificate is granted
her for Obtaining Letters of Administration

ledged their Bond in the Penalty of five Hun-
dred Pounds Conditioned as the Law Directs
for the said Administration due and faith-
full Administration of the said Decedents
Estate and Performance of his Will. Samuel
