

In the name of God Amen. Fifth day of March
1801 at 5 o'clock. I, John Thompson, of Campbell County being
of perfect mind thanks be to God for the same. I do consti-
tute and declare this my last Will and Testament as follow-
eth viz. I do desire that my Executors shall pay all
my just debts. I do leave my beloved wife Judith a part
of the Lands I now live on including the House & Buildings
from the lower end of sd. tract adjoining of Jesse Thompson
running up on both sides of the track to a large fork thence
up the left fork to my back line, and then another
line from the sd. fork to a pine at the upper end of the
plantation continuing the same course to the north line
thence down my South East line until they intersect with
Jesse Thompsons so as to include the lower part of sd. Lands with
two negroes, to wit. Frank, Susanah, & Buck, two horses one
male of color & a colt, one bed, bedstead, furniture & two Cows
I also four cows & piggs, two butter dishes, & two butter plates
knives & forks & I do give my daughter Mildred the wife
of Tho. C. Black, two young Negroes by name Peter & Fanny

up the left fork to my back line, and then another
line from the sd. fork to a post at the upper end of the
plantation continuing the same course to Womablos line
thence down my South Fork line until they intersect with
the Moormans road to include the lower part of sd. lands, also
three negroes, to wit. Frank, Sumner, & Buck, two horses, one
yoke of oxen, 1 cart, one bed, bedstead & furniture, two cows
1 calf, four cows & piggs, two Peter Leches, 1/2 doz. puter plates
silverware & 1 team. Give my daughter & children the wife
of Tho. C. Clark, two young Negroes by name Peter & Fanny
a bag, Maria two cows 1 calf, one bed & furniture, 1/2 doz.
puter plates, knives & forks for each man in the sd. blacks
possession. I give my son Achilles my tract of
land on Buff. Creek & one Negro boy by name Joe in case
the sd. Joe should die before my son should become of
sufficient age or marry then a boy named Tony, a horse
and saddle, two cows & calf, one bed & furniture, 1/2 doz.
puter plates 1/2 doz. knives & forks for each.

Now I give unto my two sons a Luciah & James the Tract of
Land whereon I now live & the tract adjoining the same
after the death of my wife an equal division made
Luciah the upper part & James the lower part adjoining
Jeffs Alcoman if they becomes of lawful age or marry
before the death of my wife they or either of them to take
possession in common between them the upper part of
the Lands not lost my wife also I give a young negro
of equal value of a child as above a horse & saddle
two Cows & Calves a Bed & furniture 1/2 dozen butter plates
1/2 doz knives & forks unto each of them for ever Now
I give unto my daughters by name Elizabeth & Nancy
Lucy Patsy & Judith Clark unto each as much of
my Estate as I have given to my daughter a child
as soon as they may become of age or either may
marry. In case my beloved wife should survive with
child or children she or if a son I give him a tract of
Land call'd Carvers Run only call'd Poer a young negro
of equal value with his other brothers a horse & saddle two

of equal value with his other children a house & saddle two
cow scalps a bed & furniture $\frac{1}{2}$ doz put on plates $\frac{1}{2}$ doz
knives & forks, if a Daughter to be made equal with
the rest of its sisters out of my Estate. Now if either of
my said children should die before they become of
lawfull age or marry their parts of the Estate shall be
equally divided among the survivors. Now its my desire
that my Estate shall be kept as much together as possible
in order to enable my executors to pay of the above legacies
to wit the children &c. in case my wife should have a
daughter those two tracts of land, as above called for
Rents, to be sold and the money of ~~the~~ sold in aid in dis-
charging the above legacies &c. Now its my desire at the
death of my wife that there shall be an equal division
of the hole of my Estate not disposed of among each
of my children to them and their heirs forever. Now

The within last Will and Testament of Andrew Moorman
Recorded was proved by the oaths of George Cabell and James
Clark and by the solemn affirmation of Jesse Moorman
Witnesses thereto subscribed and ordered to be recorded.
And on the motion of John Clark Jr and Thomas M. Clark
two of the Executors in the said Will named who made oath
thereto according to Law, certificate is granted them for ob-
taining probate thereof in due form giving security. Where-
upon they together with James Clark, William Henderson and
William Moorman their securities entered into and acknowledged
their Bond in the penalty of two thousand pounds conditioned
as the Law directs for the said Executors due and faithful

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William Mosman their securities entered into and acknowledged
their Bond in the penalty of two thousand pounds condition
as the Law directs for the said Executors due and faithful
administration of the said Decedents Estate and performance of
his Will. Liberty being reserved to other Executors in the said
Will named to join in the probate thereof when they shall
think fit
