and Testament making Void all Other Wills heretofore
by me made. I give to my son Bartholomew
Stovall my Negro fellow Ned which he has now in
Possession also Four Hundred Acres of Land whereon
he now lives. I give to my Daughter Rachel Turner
my Negro fellow Ben and Nancy which she has
now in Possession. I give to my Daughter Martha
Stovall Negro Bess and her Increase also a young
mare Sny and Saddle a feather Bed and fur-
niture I give to my Daughter Anne Negro Girl Fan-
na and my Boy Peter. One Bed and furniture
also my Small Horse and a Side Saddle. I give to
my son James Stovall my Negro boy Frank and my
Negro Girl Lucy also my Tract of Land lying on
the West Bank of the River William

my son James Stovall my Negro boy Frank and my
Negro Girl Lucy also my Tract of Land lying on
Deep Branch of Stone Wall Creek joining William
Bradlys Land. I give to my son George Stovall Junr.
my Negro boy Bob and my Negro Girl Phillis
also the Tract of Land whereon I now live after his
Mothers Decease and not before. I give to my Daugh-
ter Dorothy my Negro man Tucker and my Negro
Girl Agga. a Bed and furniture. And as for my
Children that I had by my former Wife. I have
already give them their Portions and my desire
is that they may have no more. Now my beloved
Wife Elizabeth Stovall the Land and Plantation
whereon I now live. Also the Tract of Land whereon
my son John lives during her natural life. and
also my Negroes Sargo Old Nancy Tom and Cato
and all her Children unmentioned and all my

House hold furniture and Stock to be hers during
her Natural life and to be at her disposal at
her Decease to the Issue of her Body. I also Order
my Tract of Land Joining the Land where I for
merly lived Commonly known by the name of
Stovalls Ferry to be sold also my Mill and Tract
of Land lying in Amherst County I Order to be
sold and as for my son John Stovall I have
already given him a Horse Two Cows and Calves
a feather Bed and furniture I also gave him my
Negro man Sam after his Mothers Decease I have
by Constitute and appoint my beloved Wife Eliza
beth Stovall and my Son in Law Henry Turner
Executry and Executor of this my last Will and
Testament without giving any Security. I Order
that there may be no appraisement or Sale of this
my Estate In Testimony whereof I have hereunto

that there may be no appraisement or sale of this
