of our Marriage I also give her during Life all the
negroes with their Increase that she had in her
possession by the aforesaid Will of Jeremiah

her Six Head of Horses (to wit) Two Bay mares
known by the name of Lady and Bonny, one
dark Bay Horse known by the name of Elliot
one Roan Horse, Two Bay Colts belonging to
the aforesaid Hares. Also I give her Two thirds
of all the Cattle on the aforesaid plantation
and the other third I give to my son Benjamin
to be Equally Divided according to their several
sizes or Value. I also give her all the stock of
hogs and sheep and all the Household furni-
ture. Except one Bed with good furniture known
by the name of my Bed Which I give to my son
Benjamin Also I give her all the plantation
utensils. Next I give to my son John Two D.

Next I give to my son Robert and his heirs for-

one hundred and fifty Acres be the same more
or less adjoining Joneses and Carsons Lines to be
laid off by a line Beginning near Joneses Corner
Close by the fence known by the name of the
Spring house field fence. Thence running a
direct Line so as to Include the meadow spring

 few yards thence on Thomas Carsons line for quantity
