working tools of all sorts all to be at her disposal.
I Give to my daughter Elizabeth besides what she has
of her own man negro man married. Neds and his
worth Twenty Pounds too Coates and the half of the
Land and the side he now lives on to be supported
with with fire wood and sales out of the side and
all the working tools and Household and Kitchen furni-
ture. I Give my son John the other half of the Land
the the side he lives on and at my wifes death
the remainder of my estate to be equally divided
among all my children. I Will Love my wife and

son John Dearing this is my last Will and Testament
I am making all other Wills by me made void and
Unlawful, I seal my hand. Well.

All Court Held for Hampshire County, April 17th 1791
The within last Will and Testament of John
Dearing Deceased was proved by the Oaths of James
Mitchell and Richard Smith two of the witnesses thereto
subscribed and Ordered to be Recorded. And on
the motion of John Dearing the Executor therein
named who made Oaths thereto According to
Law Certificate is granted him for obtaining
probate thereof in due form giving security.

Whoseupon

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Whereupon he together with William Jordan and John
 Marshall his Associates entered into and acknowledged
 their Bond in the Penalty of One Thousand Dollars
 conditioned as the said deede for the said Executors
 and faithful Administration of the said Decedents
 Estate and performance of his Will. Liberty being
 reserved the Executors in the said Will named to
 join in the probate when she shall think fit.
