at the discretion of my Executor nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I Shall Receive the Same again by the mighty power of God & as touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it Has pleased God to bless me With this life I give & devise & dispose of the Same in the Following manner & form

Imprimus I give & bequeath to Hannah Powell my dear beloved Wife the Land & plantation whereon I now do live during her life & Widow hood but as soon as she marries for the said Land & plantation to Return to my two sons John & David as

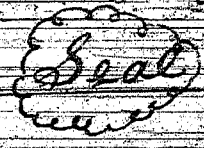
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Soon as they come to lawfull age to be Equally
Divided betwixt them also I give to my son John
one bay horse also I give to my ^{son} David one gray horse
to be theirs when they come to Lawfull age as to the
rest of my Stock & moveables I desire that they may
all be cept together for the use of my wife & the
rest of my Children until such times as they are
Married or come to lawfull age & for the Gals to
have an Equal part of all the Rest of the Stock
and moveables as far forth as what they have in
breast all the Children an equal part and of my
Lawfull debts to be paid out of the Estate This is
not allowing but disanuling all other Wills made by
me heretofore
