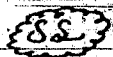


148 In the name of God Amen the seventh day of

testament that is to say principally and first of
all I give and recommend my soul into the hands
of Almighty God who gave it and my body I recommend
to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian manner
at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but
at the general resurrection to receive it again by the
mighty power of God. And touching the worldly estate
wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life
I give demise and dispose of the same in the following
manner and form. Infirmities I give unto my son

I give demise and dispose of the same in the following
manner and form. Infirmities I give unto my son
John Rattakin the tract of land whereon he now
liveth to him and his heirs and assigns forever. Item
I lend unto my beloved wife Rachel the house and
land whereon I now live until my son Laurence
comes to the age of twenty one years and after
that I give and bequeath the said house and land
to my son Laurence his heirs and assigns forever on
conditions that he allows his mother a sufficient
maintainance and her choice room in the house
to live in during her natural life also I leave all
my movable property and household furniture
at her disposal. I leave to my Daughter Ann Moore
seven Dollars. I leave to my daughter Sarah Trent
two Dollars. I leave unto my son in Law Isaac Little

two Dollars. I leave unto my daughters Mary, Elizabeth, Martha
Rebecca and Catharine thirty four Dollars each. All the above
legacies are to be paid out of the money which Robert
and Archer Williamson owes me and the remainder is to
pay my other debts. I hereby disannul revoke and disallow
all former wills and testaments whatsoever made by
me ratifying and confirming this and no other to be
my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have
herewith set my hand and seal. the day and year first
above written

and relict of the said Patrick Patekin leave is given
her to administer on the said decedents estate who
made oath thereto according to Law and gave bond
and security whereupon she together with Archer
Williamson John Patekin Junr and Robert Williamson
acknowledged their bond in the penalty of twelve
hundred dollars conditioned as the Law directs for
the said Administratrix due and faithful admi-
nistration on the said decedents estate and perfor-
mance of his will
