this my Last Will and Testament first of all I
Recommend my soul unto the Lord as unto the
hand of a infirett being and as for my body my
desire is it should be decently buried as is common
for to be done or as my friends left behind may think
fit and as for what little Worldly goods it has
pleased the Lord To bless me with in this Life I
give & dispose of in the following manner and
form (VIZ) First after my just debts is all Paid
I give my loving wife Sarah Furrall all my estate
both real and personal during her natural
life Excepting my stock she being not able
to maintain that I only give her my Wife one
Cow & Calf such as she shall chuse & the rest to be
divided amongst my children

and I have now I have given her my Wife and
Cow & Calf such as she shall chuse & the rest to be
divided amongst my Children hereafter menti-
oned & at the death of my Wife the Cow and
increfs to return to my Children again I likewise
give my Wife the newest bed and Furniture
to her & her heirs forever & I likewise give my
wife one mare which is to return to my Chil-
dren again at my wife death & if it should
not suite my wife to live on place after my
death she is not to take any thing off the
place except the bed the cow and Mare
& at her death all to Return again except the
bed and that I have above given to her
and to her heirs there is likewise Two Ten
Pound bonds that I have on Peter Clarywell

a balance due me for my land sold him which my
wife is to be supported with she likewise is to
have her lifetime in the Land if she Chuses
At my Wife death what remains of my estate is
to be Equally divided among my four child
ren or their heirs. Lastly I leave Benja. Hadson &
Peter Claywell Executors of this my Last Will
& Testament ^{and} do hereby revoke & deny all other
Wills by me made & doth acknowledge this
as my last Will and Testament in Witnes
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
this 28 day of Novem^r 1792. Peter ^{his} Junke ^(Seal)

together with Thomas M. Clark & Robert
Irvine their securities entered into and
acknowledged their bond in the penalty

of Five hundred Dollars Conditioned as the
Law directs for the said Executor to do and
faithfull administration of the said Decedents
Estate and Performance of his Will.
