Virginia being in my perfect senses and memory and
calling to mind the mortality of this body and that it is
appointed for all men to die I do make and ordain this my last
Will and Testament in manner as follows I do first of
all Give my soul to God who gave it in hope that God will
receive my soul with free and full Pardon of my sins done in
this life and my body to be buried in a Christian manner at
the discretion of my Executors And my worldly Goods which
I hath placed God to bestow on me which I give and
bequeath

begin in manner as followeth to Joshua Douglass and James Douglas,
the Executors that I now leave on each having an equal share
and consideration of the place they are to keep three Millions
in Virtuals and clothes and a Horse to ride where she has any
business and they are to pay Betty Douglass ten Pound each of
them the Land and the Perpetuance becoming to it I leave to
them three Acres and a half for ever to Robert Douglass I
leave a English shilling in a Piston to George Cairns one Dollar
to Polly Clonans one Dollar to Wamey Douglass one Dollar
to James Douglass I leave the best Horse on the place at the
old Woman's death the Moulls and Moull furnish to be at
her disposing at her death and if the old Woman have any
cause of complaint she may apply to the Executors and they
have it in their power to take the place and also have living
out of it all lawfull Deats to be paid of the Estate. I Do
heavily appoint my beloved friends Eulla Gilloit and William
Heas as my Executors of my Last Will and Testament. At
Wilmington my Hand and Seal this Jun the fifteenth
one thousand one hundred and thirty six.

A Court held for Campbell County September 4th 1794

The within Last Will and Testament of Robert Douglass
Decd. was proved by the Oath of Daniel Evans the Witness thereto
subscribed, And on the solemn affirmation of Micajah Thompson
(being one of the People called Quakers) who Depose that and saith
that the said Will was altogether made by the Testators own hand
Whereupon It is Ordered to be Recorded.

And on the Motion of William Hay one of the Executors on
the said Will named who made Oath thereto according to
Law certificate is granted him for claiming of Probate thereof
in due form giving Security. Whereupon he together with
Daniel Evans his Surety entered into and acknowledged their
Bond

Bond in the penalty of one thousand five hundred
Dollars conditioned according to Law for the said
Executor due and faithful Administration of the said
Decedent Estate and performance of his Will
Liberty being reserved the said Executor in the said
Will named to join in the Probate thereof whom he
shall think fit
