Will and Testament, that is to say Principally
by and first of all I give and recommend
my soul into the hands of God that gave it
and as for my body I recommend it to the earth to

lived in a christian like and decent man-
ner at the direction of my Executor not.

setting but at the General Resurrection I
shall receive the same again by the mighty
Power of God, and as touching such Worldly
Estates as herewith it hath pleased God to
bless me with in this life, I give devise
and dispose of the same in the following
manner and form. *Imprimis* it is my

Will and I do desire that in the first place
^{all} my last debts and funeral charges be paid
and satisfied. Then I give and bequeath unto

my Well beloved wife Ann the Land and
Tenements where I now live with all the
Furniture arising from the same with the

Household Furniture, Kitchen Furniture

graciously allowing from the same with the
Houses household furniture, Kitchen furniture
instruments of husbandry and all my
stock of Horses Cattle sheep and hogs to her
and to be at her disposal during her Natural
life and at her Decease it is my desire
that my Land and tenements be sold giving
Twelve Months Credit for the same to the
purchaser and the Money to be divided
between my daughters hereafter named, Viz.
Elizabeth, Catherine Abby and Thomas
and if either of my daughters should die
before their Mother or before they receive their
said dividend to be divided between my surviv-
ing Daughters, and also that my stock that
shall

shall then be sold for Ready Money and
divided as above directed; And I do hereby desire
that my well beloved wife may give to any
of her daughters, above named any part of the
movables as she thinks they are inclined off.
Now it is my Will and I do desire that my son
James and Robert be content and satisfied as
to this my last Will as I have given the part of
my Estate allotted them before the making of this
(continued) Also that my daughter Mary
Rowland be content with what part of my Estate
I gave her before. Now it is my Will and I
do desire that my daughters above mentioned
do pay to their sister Anne Prosser when the Land
is sold and the Money received for it half
fourth current Money of Virginia as of their

is sold and the Money received for it fully
found current Money of Virginia as if their
Sister Anne should die before the Money is
paid, it is my desire it shall be paid to her
son Robert and her daughter Tabitha Twenty
Pound to each. Item it is my Will and I do
desire that my wife do give to my Grandson
Pleasant Russell one Horse and saddle and
also that if he stay with her that she give
him necessary schooling. Item I do hereby make
my last Will improve my wife and daughter
above mentioned to make a good and law
full Dead in fee simple to the purchaser
after receiving the Money for the same
And also to make a good and sufficient
Deed

Went to the upper part of my land where
James Boag now lives beginning right my
upper fence and returning to my back
line and thence to my upper corner and
thence to Stomach line to Chedah Stegus on
his paying them Twenty five shilling
for every Acre within the said line, to the
same or more (if) then I do hereby constitute
make and Ordain my well beloved wife Ann
my only and sole Executor to this my last
Will and Testament, and I do hereby disavow
revoke and disannul all and every other
former Testaments Wills and Legacies and
Executors by me in any ways before this time
made made and bequeathed. Ratifying
and confirming this and no other to be my

Last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal
the Day and Year above Written.

and acknowledged their Bond in the penalty
of three thousand pounds conditioned according
to Law for the said Executrix due and faithful
administration of the said Decedent's Estate
and Performance of his Will.
