and the remainder four teen Hundred

are paid leave all the rest of Personal Estate

Margaret and Susanna Haverston to them and their
heirs and assigns forever the Negroe Beck to remain
in the Possession of their Mother during her Natural
life and it is to be Understood that the Legacies be-
queathed the said Puffcilla Margaret and Susan-
na shall be Divided in such manner that Mar-
garet and Susanna shall have each as much
Money or Land more than Puffcilla as will be e-
qual in Value to the Negroe Boy David. Lastly
I constitute and Appoint my Trusty friends Ro-
bert Alexander Executor of this my Last Will and
Testament Ratifying and Confirming this and no
other In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this 9th day of February 1782.
