receive the same againe by the mighty
Power of God. and as touching such
Worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased
God to bless me in this life I give
devise

demise and dispose of the same in the following
manner and form I give unto my William
Walker and his Heirs all the Land I hold upon
the East side of Hall Creek meeting House Road
being upon Mitchells line. I give to my son
Thomas Walker and his Heirs one Negro man
named Harry also one feather Bed & Furni-
ture it is to be the fourth choice. I give unto
my son Charles Walker and his Heirs the
remainder of all my Land. I also give
unto my son Charles Walker and his Heirs
five Negroes Two Women each named Lett
also their two Children named Gust and
Will, also one Negro Boy named Tom
them and their increase forever. I also
lend to my son Charles Walker one Negro
Man named Moses till my son Samuel
Walker's son William Walker come to age
of Twenty one years and for the profits of
the said Negro Moses my son Charles is
to give William & Richard James Walker

sons to my son Samuel Walker each of
them three years schooling also I give
to my son Charles Walker & his heirs his first
choise of a feather Bed and furniture also two
work Horses and one yoke of oxen I give un-
to my Daughter Nancy Walker one Negro
woman named Winney, also one Negro
girl named Ruthell to her and her heirs
lawfully begotten if none such heir then
to go to my son Charles Walker & his heirs
I also give to my Daughter Nancy Walker
one feather Bed and furniture her second
choise. I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth
Walker and her heirs lawfully begotten
one Negro man named Jesse also one
Negro Girl named Pious if none such
heir to return to my son Charles Walker
I also

I also give unto my daughter Elizabeth Walker
one feather Bed and furniture her share
also one bay horse colt called Bay Boy
I also leave unto my son Baps the wife of Peter
Baps one Negro woman named Jenny
during the said Uxor Baps life and after
that to be equally divided amongst her
three children Elizabeth William
Richard James Walker also the Negro
man Moses which is lent to my son
Charles is then to be equally divided
among the last three named. I give
unto my daughter Sarah one Shilling
Sterling and for all that remains of
my Estate after such divisions as aforesaid
I desire may be equally divided into six
parts and then Elizabeth, William &
Richard James Walker children of my
son Samuel Walker each have one
sixth part and lastly I constitute &
appoint my son Baps

sixth part. And lastly I constitute &
appoint my sons Thomas and Charles
Walker Executors of this my last Will and
Testament. as Writings my hand and
seal the day & year above written

they together with Josias Bullock and John
Clayton their securities entered into acknow-
ledged their Bond in the penalty of £3000
conditioned as the Law directs for the said
Executors due and faithful administration
of the said Decedent's Estate & performance
