and Dismiss and Dispeace of the same in the fol
lowing manner and form. Item I lend unto my
Loving Wife Lucy Intwining her Natural Life the
Thirds of the Land and Plantations the House Includ
ed where I now live and After her Discease I give
unto my son Richard One Hundred Acres of the said
above mentioned Land the above mentioned House
Included I also give unto my Son Thomas Three Hun
dred Acres of Land being the remaining Part of the a
fore mentioned Tract I also give unto my Son Richard
One Hundred and forty six Acres of Land Joining
the Tract I formerly gave him I also give unto my Lov
ing Wife Lucy Seven Hundred and Forty Acres and
an half Acres of Land lying in Buckingham County
laying on the Branches of Neck Island and James
River to dispose of as she pleases I also lend unto

my Wife Lucy Seven Hundred and thirty acres with
an half Acres of Land lying in Buckingham County
lying on the Branches of Neck Island and James
River to dispose of as she pleases I also lend unto
my loving Wife Lucy the Third part of the Negroes
Namely Peter Spear Jane Jude Sam Jack Ben
Rachel Nan Bob Pat Fanna also of the Stock and
Moveables Induring her Natural Life I also give
unto my Two Sons Richard and Thomas the remain
ing two thirds of the above mentioned Negroes Stock
and Moveables Item I give unto my Grand Son Tho
mas Ogles by Refser One Negro man named York
under the Care of Jonathan Refser I likewise consti
tute my son Richard Oglesby and Lucy my Wife
Executors of this my last Will and Testament
In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and Seal the day and date above mentioned

And on the Motion of Richard Oglesby the Executor therein named who made Oath thereto according to Law Certificate is granted him for Obtaining Probate thereof on due form giving Security Whereupon he together with Charles Hall William Gilliam Charles Gilliam and John Helm his Securities entered into and Acknowledged their Bond in the Penalty of Two Thousand Pounds Conditioned as the Law Directs for the said Executors due and faithful Administration of the said Decedent's Estate.

And let it be remembered that John Harris Witnesses thereto Subscrib-
ed and Ordered to be Recorded. And on the Motion of Richard Oglesby the Executor therein named
who made Oath thereto according to Law Certificate
is granted him for Obtaining Probate thereof in
due form giving Security Whereupon he together
with Charles Hall William Gilliam Charles Gilliam
and John Helm his Securities entered into and
Acknowledged their Bond in the Penalty of Two
Thousand Pounds Conditioned as the Law Directs
for the said Executors due and faithful Admi-
nistration of the said Decedent's Estate and Per-
formance of his Will. Lucy Oglesby the Executrix
in the said Will named having refused in Open
Court to join in the Probate thereof.
