wife my house and lot in the town of Lynchburg.
Henn. After the payment of ^{all} my just debts, I give the res-
idue of my estate of whatever nature or kind to my
aforesaid Wife, except that property to which I will be
entitled after the death of my mother, under a deed
of gift made by my father, which property contained

in the deed aforesaid it is my will and desire should
 be equally divided between my wife and my sister.
 I appoint my wife executrix and my friend William
 Presley Claiborne executor of this my last will and
 testament, hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore
 made. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and affixed my seal this 22^d day of January
 1807. Wilson Davenport
