and maintainance during her my said wifes life, and
at her death the remainder, if any, to be sold and
equally divided between my two sons Absalom Adams
and Elisha Adams, to be for them and their heirs
forever. She my said wife paying all my just debts.
And further I appoint my friend Nathaniel Rodg
executor in this my last will and testament, and
hereby revoke all other wills by me made. In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this fourth day of March one thousand seven hun-
dred and ninety seven.
