one shilling Starling a peice for their
Portion as for my Grandson John Brooks
I give for his portion five shillings Star-
ling this is my last will and Testament
apointing my son William Brooks my
hole and sole Executor and to pay my just
debts and to pay my funeral Charges so I give
my sole to God and my Body to the Divist.

Certificate is granted him for obtaining
probate thereof in due form giving
security whereupon he together with
John Wood & Jonathan Poyer his securities
entered into and acknowledged their Bonds
in the Penalty of £100 conditioned as the
Law directs for the said Executor due &
faithful administration of the said Decedent's
Estate & performance of his Will.
