One one Mill and Millen Two Dish Eight plates
and two Basins of the Choice of my Kitchen
One Box Iron and Steel one pair of fire tongs
Two Chests and my Plantation Tools One grade
Iron pot and Hooks two sheep and two flax
Hackels at her Disposal forever and the Residue
of my Estate to be Equally Divided Between
my Son John H. William Hart Walker Maria
Walker Mary Roberts and Kysah Hart
which I do hereby revoke and Disannul every
Other Will or Wills by me heretofore made I
do also Appoint and Ordain James Harts
and Edward Robertson Executors of this my
last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof
I have here to set my hand and Affixed my Seal
this 11. day of February 1785.
