And at her death I direct that my said Land be
sold and the Money arising from such sale to be
equally divided amongst all my children (Wth)
Hannah Palswin Hutchison, John Hutchison
William Hutchison, Nancy Hutchison, Polly
Hutchison, David Hutchison, Samuel Hutchison
Petsy Marshall Hutchison, and Sally Wilkins
Hutchison; And I do hereby authorize my Executors
hereafter named or the survivors of them, to sell and
convey the said Land to the purchaser or purchasers
thereof (in fee simple) together with my Land sit
Kentucky if a title can be procured, and the
Money equally divided amongst all my children
aforesaid, my slaves and personal Estate of all kinds
whatever to be equally divided amongst my wife and
all my children. If any of my children die before
they are of age or marry I direct their parts to be
equally divided amongst their surviving brothers

they arrive of age or Mary, I direct their part to be
equally divided amongst their surviving brothers
and sisters. I direct that my daughters live in my
Mansion house till they marry and have their parts
of my personal Estate allotted them at the time of
Marriage and my sons when they arrive at the age of
twenty one years. I also direct that my sons William
David and Samuel be bound to trades at the discretion
of my Executors. If my wife should survive them I
direct my Land to be rented for the purpose of raising
my Young Children. And the sale thereof to take place
when my youngest Child arrives to the age of eighteen
years, in case any dispute should arise between my
Exors and Legatees, I direct the same may be referred
to Robert Haywood, Achilles Mooriman and
Edmund Merdoun and their Award to be binding on
the Parties. Lastly I constitute and appoint my
lawful wife Executrix and my son John Hutchinson
and

and my lawful friend John Marshall Executors of this
