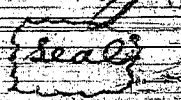
James I. William Irvine Practitioner of Physic in the

that pains be taken to collect & secure the
balances there in due. Whereas I have a brother
named James & sister named Jane who are now resi-
dent in the County of Westmorland in the State
of Pennsylvania & have Two other brothers & sisters
named Alexander & Abigail. Margaret & Elizabeth
who proposes to come from Ireland in the course of

the next Year & to join my brother James & Sister
Jane and whereas I have already advanced some
where about Seven hundred and Fifty dollars
to my brother James & Sister Jane it is my will
that my said brother and Sister be called upon
by my Executors for as exact a statement as
possible of the money so advanced To this amount
it is my will that all the proceeds of my estate
over and beyond the payment of my Debts &c.
be added and considered as forming one general
fund for the common benefit of my aforesaid

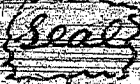

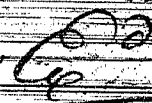
