ately after my wife's death or marriage that all my
Said and Personal Estate of every kind may be equal-
ly divided between my five children Susanna
Elizabeth John William and Christopher or their
legal representatives which I give to them and their
Heirs for ever And lastly I constitute and appoint
my friends Hason Blankinship my wife Patsy
Stone and Jas Johnson Executors of this my will
Revoking and making void all former wills by

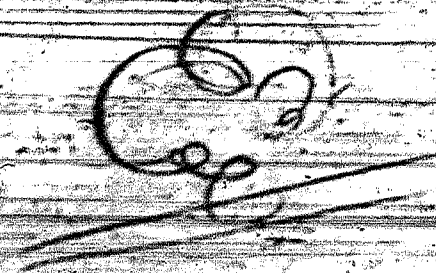

At A Court Held for Campsbee County April 8th 1799

The within last will and Testament of William
Stone Deceased was Proved by the oath of Archibald
Blankenship and Edith Blankenship and by the
solemn affirmation of Samuel Johnson and
ordered to be Recorded. And on the motion of
Patty Stone the Executrix and Hudson Blankenship
one of the Executors in the said Will named who
made oath thereto according to Law, certificate is
granted them for obtaining Probate thereof in due

form giving security. Whereupon they together
with Thomas Johnson and Henry Blankenship
their Securities entered into and acknowledged
their Bond in the Penalty of five hundred
Dollars conditioned as the Law directs for the
said Executrix and Executors due and
faithful administration of the said decen-
dent's Estate and Performance of his Will.
James Johnson the other Executor in the said
Will named having in Open Court refused
to Join in the Probate thereof.
