ral life my dwelling house together with all the land and plantation her and  
dequining and one half of the land I bought of. Madam Roger Palmer to be en-  
joyed by a line to be run across from James Richeson's line to Blackson line and after  
her death I give the said House Land and Plantations to my son Thomas Moore  
the heirs of his body and for want of such Heirs to my son Thomas  
Moore and the heirs of his body and for want of such Heirs to the Heirs of the  
body of my son Augustine Moore and for want of such Heirs to be equally di-  
vid between my two daughters Elizabeth Moore & Lucy Robinson the heirs  
of their bodies and for want of such Heirs to my sons in Law John Robinson & George  
Seaton their Heirs forever. I also give to my said wife during her life the use of all  
my plate House and Kitchen furniture and all the stocks of cattle Sheep and Hogs on the  
said Plantations and after her death I give all the said furniture half the plate and  
the two thirds of the stocks to my son Thomas Moore and the other third of the  
stock and half the plate I give to my son Thomas Moore and if the plantation  
heron before given to my wife shall not be sufficient to work her slaves upon

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as my before given to my Wife shall not be sufficient to work her I have upon  
my Will is that she shall have the choice of one of my Plantations either in  
Caroline or Antigua. To wit, to work them on I give to my said Wife two hundred  
pounds Sterling and three Slaves to wit, Calina, Isabella and Dinah, my coach  
House and coach Horses and all my Tools, I give to my son Bernard. Also all  
that Tract of Land lying in Caroline between the River James and Joseph's Woodlot and  
now a part of which I have already given to my said son by deed all of which said  
Tract of Land I give to my said son Bernard and his heirs for ever. I also give to my  
said son Bernard all the Stocks of cattle, sheep and hogs that are upon the said Land;  
the pots, pans and other things made use of on the said Plantation. I give to my said son  
Thomas also all that Tract of Land and Plantation that I bought of the Rev. Mr. Fox  
and known by the name of the Brick House and the other half of the Land and  
I bought of Martin Roger Palmer and my Water Great Mill adjoining to the  
said Land I bought of Fox but my Will is that my Wife and my two sons Augustus  
Bernard have their term ground till free at the said Mill I give the said Land  
and Mill to my said son Thomas and the heirs of his Body, and for want of such  
heirs to my son Bernard and the heirs of his body and for want of such heirs

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and no  
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to the heirs of the body of my son, Isaac Moore and for a right of such heirs to be given  
by deed of gift in my lifetime. I do hereby give and sell to my son Isaac Moore and the heirs  
of their body and for want of such heirs to my son, Isaac Moore and the heirs  
of their body forever. I also give to my son Isaac Moore all the furniture that  
came in for and belongs to the House lately built on the said Land as also the  
Stocks of cattle, sheep and Hogs that are on the said Land and plantation and  
pole pens and other things that are therein for the plantation and I give to  
my <sup>son</sup> Thomas a Tract of Land containing two thousand Acres lying in  
Spotsylvania County and is called in Deed by the name of Such Tract and  
one thousand Acres part of a Tract of Land of eight thousand three hundred and  
fifty Acres in the fork of Pamunkey the said one thousand Acres to be laid off ad-  
joining to a Tract of one thousand Acres. And Moore made the said Thomas  
by Patent by a line to be run from River to River I give the one thousand Tract of  
Land to my son Thomas and his heirs forever. I also give to my son Isaac Moore  
all the Stocks of cattle, <sup>horses</sup> sheep and Hogs that are on the said Land together  
with the pole pens and other things that are therein for the plantation and  
I give to my son Bernard Moore and his heirs forever two of my Lots in Dela

more Town wherein the dwelling house and Store room stands and the  
the house the Kitchen stands I give to my son Thomas Moore and his  
heirs forever. I give to my daughter Elizabeth. Macon Two hundred Acres  
of Land part of my said Tract of eight thousand three hundred and fifty  
Acres to be laid off at the lower end of the said Tract and on the North side of the  
Bridge Road, to her and the heirs of her body lawfully begotten I also give to my  
said daughter Elizabeth, Hannah, great Pamel, wife John and all their  
future increase which said Slaves I do hereby assign to the said Land and declare  
my mind and Will to be that the same shall descend pass and go in the same  
manner as the said Land is herein after limited and appointed I give to my dau-  
ghter Lucy Robinson five hundred Acres of Land part of the same Tract to be  
laid off at the lower end of the said Tract on the South side the Bridge Road to her  
and the heirs of her body lawfully begotten I also give to my said daughter Lucy these  
Slaves to wit: Judy, Robins Wife and great Pally at the home place and their chil-  
dren and all their future increase which said Slaves I do hereby assign to the  
said Land and declare my mind and Will to be that the same shall descend

best and of in the same manner as the said Land is hereafter limited and appointed and  
if both or either of my said daughters shall be not leaving issue of her body at the  
time of her death then I give the Land and Slaves devised to such daughter or daughter  
so dying to my son Augustine and his heirs forever he paying to his Brothers Bernard &  
Thomas two thirds of the value of the Slaves which shall descend or come to him upon  
failure of such issue as aforesaid and in case my son Augustine shall fail or refuse to  
pay to his said Brothers or their heirs the aforementioned proportion of the value of  
the Slaves so descended or come to him as aforesaid then I give the Land and Slaves  
of my said daughter or daughter [www.virginiapioneers.net](http://www.virginiapioneers.net) to my sons Bernard & Thomas their heirs  
and assigns as Tenants in common equally divided between them I give to my son  
Augustine Moore the remaining part of my said Tract of eight thousand and three  
hundred and fifty Acres and the Land whereon he now lives during his life &  
after his death I give the same to his children if he should leave any but  
he should die leaving no issue then I give the Land whereon he lives to my son  
Thomas & his heirs forever and the other Land I give to be equally divided between  
my sons Bernard and Thomas and their heirs forever but my Will and desire is  
that my son Augustine should have the Land whereon he now lives

that if my daughter in Law Ann Moore should be left a widow she should  
~~the same whom her husband was to live in five hundred Dollars of what he~~  
gave him in Spotsylvania during his life I give to my said son Augustine  
all the House and Kitchen furniture that is in the House and Kitchen where  
he lives and all the Stocks of Cattle Horses, Sheep and Hogs that are on the  
and plantations heron before given to him and on his Land in Gloucester County  
and the pole Pans and other things that are on the said Lands and plantations  
for the Plantation's use. I give my Tract of Land in this County that  
I bought of John Myatt to be equally divided between my sons Augustine  
Bernard & Thomas and my son in Law George Seaton and their heirs forever I give  
to my Wife one third part of my Slaves during her life in which third part  
my Will and desire is that she may have Neptune the coachman and  
his Wife Violet & Sambo & York & Marys & after the death of my said Wife  
I give her said third part to be equally Aug. Moore divided between my  
sons Bernard and Thomas they paying to their Brother Augustine

Court by John Robinson the younger Esq. Bernard Moore & George Seaton

Memorandum that at a Court held for King William County on Thursday  
the 11<sup>th</sup> Day of August in the 20<sup>th</sup> Y<sup>r</sup> of King George the second the within  
last Will and Testament of Augustine Moore Gent. dec'd was exhibited in  
Court by John Robinson the younger Esq<sup>r</sup>. Bernard Moore & George Seaton  
Gent. three of the Executors therein named, and Augustine Moore son & heir  
of the Testator being present, was asked by the Court if he had any thing to  
alledge why the Court should not proceed to the proof, the said Will instantly;  
he said he could say nothing against the Proof thereof only that the said  
Testator had promised him with his last Will to give him his mansion house &

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Land which by the said Will he had devised to his Brother Bernard Moore,  
whereupon Henry Braxwell, Betty Todd, Robert Tappan & three of the sub-  
scribing Witnesses proved the said Will, & the said John Robinson, Bernard  
Moore, and George Seaton took the oath of Executors and Certificate for obtain-  
ing a probat in due form was granted them pursuant to an Act of As-  
sembly in that case made and provided.
