To my son Henry Robinson I give one Negro Boy named Leonard
to him and his heirs forever should one of my last mentioned children
die without an heir lawfully Begotten of their Body their Part
is to Return to my Estate and be Equally Divided amongst my other
children the Balance and Reside of my Estate Both real and
personal I give after my Just Debts are paid to be Equally
Divided amongst my four children Thomas Robinson Benjamin
Robinson Betsy Monday Robinson and Henry Robinson.

to them and their heirs forever lastly I constitute and appoint
Capt Charles Lewis and Mr Reuben T Taylor Executors of
my last will and Testament even under my hand and seal
