revoking every other heretofore made. First I give and
bequeath unto my son William Morton, one negro Girl
named Gell and her in crease to him his heirs & assigns
forever, being part of the estate lent me by my husband
aforesaid. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Little
Joe, Morton one negro boy named Jee to him & to his heirs
and assigns forever of the same estate. Item I give & bequeath
unto my son Jacob Morton one negro man named Cooper
to him and to his heirs & assigns forever of the same estate.
I further desire and ordain that the whole of my estate as
well as that lent me by my husband not heretofore mentioned
consisting of Slaves, plantation tools, Stock & furniture of all
kinds of what nature soever, be equally divided at the
discretion of my executors amongst my children to wit,
Judith Venable, Jane Barksdale, Agnief Watkins, William

I desire may be ratified and confirmed agreeable to the
