In the Name of God Amen, Charles Turner of Charlotte
County being in a Low State of Health but of perfect sense and memory
attends to the uncertainty of this life, and being Assured that all men
must die, being desirous that my conduct may appear in a proper light,
do constitute and ordain this to be my Last will & Testament in manner
and form following Vizt. I do Give and bequeath unto my beloved
wife Mary Turner one Negroman named Ben, Item I send unto my
beloved wife during her natural life, the tract of land whereof I now
dwell lying on the waters of Cub Creek in the County aforesaid, Item
I give unto my son Josiah Turner and my daughter Susanna Turner
and the child ^{that} my wife is now pregnant with all my personal estate to
be equally divided at the death of my beloved wife except the land and
it is my will that my son Josiah and the child that my wife is now
pregnant with if a boy for the land to be equally divided between them.
Item lastly I do appoint my beloved wife, and Temple Davis & Peter Davis
Executors of this my Last will & Testament, whereof I have hereunto set my
hand this 11th day of March 1799

and the child ^{that} my wife is now pregnant with all my personal estate to
be equally divided at the death of my beloved wife except the land and
it is my will that my son Isaac and the child that my wife is now
pregnant with if a boy for the land to be equally divided between them.
I now lastly I do appoint my beloved wife, and Temple Davis & Peter Jones
Executors of this my Last will & Testament, whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this twenty second day of October 1783.

At a Court held for Charlotte County the 3^d Day of May 1784.

This Last Will & Testament of Charles Tarrant dec^d was exhibited in Court by
Mary Tarrant the Executrix therein named, and the same was proved by the oaths
of Charles Jordan and Martha Jordan two of the witnesses hereto subscribed
and adjured to be true & set. And on the Motion of the said Executrix who
made oath according to law to testify that she is entitled her & standing a part
of the said Will, she giving security, whereupon she with Robert Tarrant
her security entered into and acknowledged their bond for that purpose.
