At a Court held for Charlotte County the second day September 1/8th 1792
The foregoing Codicil of Clement Read dec^d was Exhibited in Court by
Mary Read Jun^r bearing date the tenth day of October, one Thousand Seven
hundred and Eighty, as appeared from the Letter there to Subjoined, and the same
appearing to be the hand Writing of the said Clement ^{Read} by the oath of Thomas
Read and Edmund Read, with other corroborating circumstances Concurring
ordered that the same be established and admitted to Record on the Motion
of the said Mary Read, who made oath according to Law Certificate is granted her
for obtaining Letters of Administration of the said Estate with the Council Annexed
Requering Security whereupon the said Mary Read her Security entered into and
forfeited their bond for that purpose. ^{Witness my hand and Seal this 10th day of September 1792}
