lands and all my Slaves & all my Stocks of all kinds & all
my furnitures & every thing belonging to ^{me to} be equally divided
among all my sister Mary Oliver's Children I give it to them
and their heirs forever. And I leave my Friends Thomas
Oliver & Edmund F. Partrick my exors of this my last will
& testament. In Witness whereof I have hereof set my hand
& set my seal this tenth day of December One thousand

Bond according to Law for that purpose. Reserving Liberty to
other Executor to join in the probate thereof when he
shall think fit.
