and Parish of Cornwall being of sound mind and memory, mindful of the
uncertainty of life and the expediency of being at all times prepared for death in
order to the just & peaceable settlement of my worldly affairs after my decease do
make and constitute this my last will & testament in manner & form following -
I perceive, my body I leave to the care of my Executors (to be hereafter named) to
be buried in a decent & Christian like manner. My soul I commit to God who gave
it in hope of eternal Life through Jesus Christ my Lord. - I then I bequeath to
my Daughter Mary Hamilton during her life my negro girl Pindora and after her
decease I give and bequeath her to the children of my said daughter Mary namely
Mary, Abner, Flipping and Mary (to the survivors & survivors of them) to them
and their heirs forever to be equally divided among them. - I then I bequeath to my
daughter Sarah Mavor during her life my negro girl Lucy and after her decease
I give and bequeath her with her increase to the children of my said daughter Sarah
to them and their heirs forever to be equally divided among them.

I give and bequeath to my grand Daughter Martha Holt my negro woman Mary to her and her heirs forever and in case of her death without issue I give bequeath the said Mary with her increase in like manner to my grand daughter Lucy Holt — I give and bequeath to my grand Daughter Lucinda Mann my slave mare to her and her heirs forever — I give and bequeath to my children Elizabeth Parkedale, Sarah L. Coleman, William Watson (during his life and after his death to his daughter Elizabeth) Lucy Holt and Anne Luce the whole remainder of my worldly goods that is to say my negro woman Lucy with her increase not before given my beds & furniture my horses, cattle, sheep & hogs with every other article of thing not otherwise disposed of by this will them and their heirs forever to be equally divided among them. And to this my last will I appoint Samuel White and Richard Garris Sen^r my only executors & do hereby revoke and set aside all other Wills by me heretofore made declaring this to be my last and only will In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 7th day of April 1787.
