Debts and Duties are Paid, I give unto my beloved Wife Lydia Gwin, the  
following Slaves Viz, Winney, Dickey and Chaibana to her life her heirs and  
assigns and to my said Wife the residue of my E. E. to be holden to her  
during her life. I give and bequeath unto

George Gwin, son of

my Brother David Gwin after the Death of my Wife the remainder of my estate  
with a full Power (except the Slave already given to my Wife) as a full power  
to him his heirs and assigns to sell my wife Lydia Gwin Executors and my  
friends Paul Carrington, Paul Carrington Junr. and Little Fox Station Executors  
of this my last Will and Testament, annulling all other Wills heretofore made. His  
further my Will, that my Executors and my Executors should sell any part of  
my estate, whether Land, Slaves, or any other part of my Estate, that they should  
think proper for the purpose of paying of Debts or any other purpose whatso-  
ever, also that they Purchase for my Estate any thing that they in their discretion  
should think most advantageous to the Estate. In Witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 15<sup>th</sup> day of April 1786.
