my daughter Sarah one bed and furniture half my husband ware, half my
pewter & one chest. The residue constitute make and adorn Stephen D. Turner
and James Turner the sole executors of this my last Will & testament. I do hereby
utterly disavow revoke and Disannul all and every other former testaments

Recorded, and on the motion of the said Stephen D Turner who made Oath accordi-
ng to Law Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said
Will in due form he giving security whereupon he with Charles Mason
his security entered into and acknowledged their Bond according to
Law for that purpose, Reserving Liberty to the other executors to Join in
the probate thereof when he shall think fit. And At a Court held for
the said County the 11th day of July 1796 the same was further proved by the
Oaths of Edward Eans - and ordered to be certified.
