In the name of God Amen the twenty seventh day of April one thousand seven hundred and eighty nine I Isabella Hard being weak in body but sound in senses and perfect memory do make this my last will and testament In the first place I recommend my soul to the hands of God that gave it to be buried in a decent manner And as for what worldly good it has pleased God to bless me with I give in the following manner Item I give unto my Grand daughter Martha Parsons daughter of William Parsons sixty pounds to her and her heirs and if she dies without issue to go to her sister Margaret Parsons. Item I give unto my grand daughter Margaret Parsons Daughter of William Parsons forty pounds to her and her heirs and if she dies without issue to be equally divided among the surviving sisters Item I give unto my grandson Major Parsons son of William Parsons five pounds to be put in to the hands of a Margtather father for his immediate support and after my grand daughter Mary Parsons being furnished with two good Gowns and a good Hat and all other necessary Expences being paid my will is when the crop is finished the stock of every kind household furniture Crop &c be sold and the money arising therefrom with the bond and debts due me and Cash on hand to be equally divided between my five grand Children Namely William Parsons Mary Parsons Martha Parsons Margaret Parsons & Major Parsons sons and daughters of William Parsons and lastly I appoint and ordain William Marshall and Henry

Henry Madison, who made Oath according to law. Certificate is granted them
for obtaining a probate of the said Will, they giving Security whereupon they

Grand son John Foster son of George the sum of five ^{sterling} shillings and no more.
I give to my son Josiah Foster all the rest of my Negroes not herein particularly
mentioned to him and his heirs forever. I give also to my said son Josiah, the
