all matters where I may be interested. I give and devise all my worldly Estate
of every kind and denomination which I am possessed or am interested to be equally
divided amongst all my Children to wit, Betsey, Dianna, Anne, and Timothy
Dickerson to each of them, their respective parts, and to their respective heirs forever
As my said Children at my death will be without father or mother and of
course destitute of paternal care I beg of my Executors to be visiting and
contributing their friendly assistance in the care & nurture of my poor orphans
and their little property in such manner as their kindness & common sense will
admit of. I do hereby appoint my friends George Givens & Paul Longmire
Executors to this my last will and Testament - to which I do subscribe as such in
my hand and affix my seal this 23rd day of November 1786
